We must admit to ourselves that we have made mistakes in the past; perhaps by not loving deeply enough, or forgiving, or treating our neighbours as ourselves, or keeping love in all our communications; we must admit to missing the mark in many things. But as we recognise the Holy Spirit within us, we see the true source of all things, and we embody the Christ in thought, word and deed, and transcend human imperfections to become a more pure channel for God's grace. For this we give thanks.

The Gospel for the 10th Sunday after Trinity is from the words of Master Hilarion.

Hilarion said - Now tell your people that I say this - they go to church on Sunday and they believe in the life after death on Sunday, and in divine healing and miracles on Sunday; they believe in the Christ who walked the waters and healed the sick on Sunday, but the rest of the week they remove the cloak of devotion and belief, and have great fear and do not love or believe, and their devotion and faith is small. If we have a promise from God, we must believe it or not believe it. Is God speaking truth or is God a liar. If we believe in Godly devotion we will have faith, and we will know his promise is true. If we practice Godly devotion, we have no need of promises, for we have become part of God.
